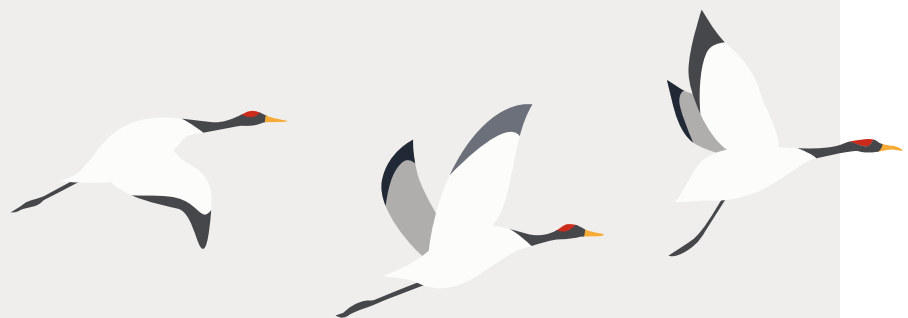

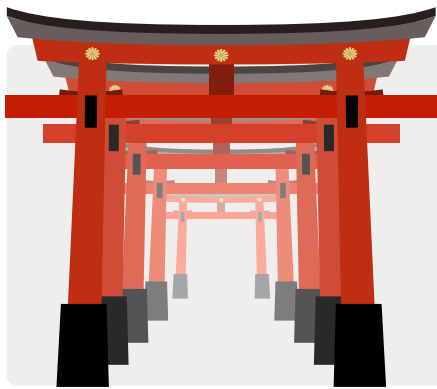

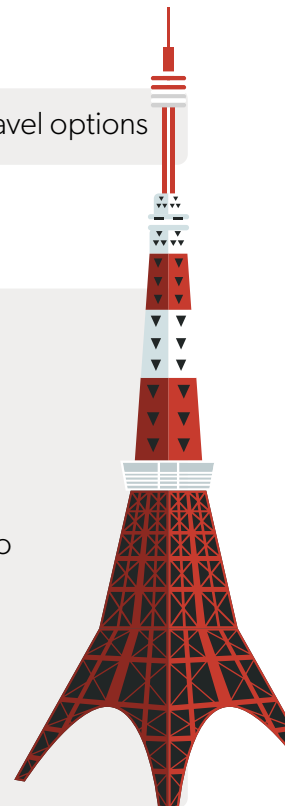

GLOSSARY

Bullet train-JR Pass (Japan Rail Pass)

A special rail pass available exclusively to foreign tourists, allowing unlimited travel on Japan Railways (JR) trains, including Shinkansen (bullet trains), for a set number of days (e.g., 7, 14, or 21 days).

Shinkansen

Japan's high-speed bullet trains that connect major cities such as Tokyo, Kyoto, Osaka, and Hiroshima. They are known for punctuality, comfort, and speed (up to 320 km/h).



Ryokan

Traditional Japanese inns that offer a more authentic experience of Japanese culture. Guests sleep on futons in tatami-matted rooms, enjoy kaiseki (multi-course meals), and often have access to communal baths (onsen).

Tatami

A type of mat made from rice straw, traditionally used as flooring in Japanese-style rooms. Many ryokan and traditional homes feature tatami flooring.

Kaiseki

A traditional multi-course Japanese dinner, often served at ryokan or upscale restaurants. Kaiseki meals focus on seasonal ingredients, delicate presentation, and multiple small dishes that highlight different cooking techniques.



Onsen

Natural hot springs, often located in scenic areas. Onsens are a big part of Japanese culture and are considered a relaxing and healing experience. Visitors must follow strict etiquette, including showering before entering the communal bath and bathing nude.

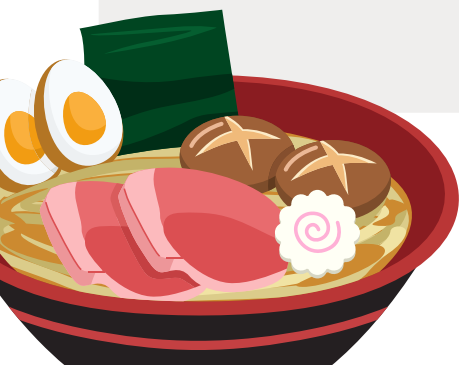


Suica / Pasma Cards

Prepaid smart cards used for public transportation (trains, buses, and even some taxis) in Japan. These cards can also be used to make small purchases at vending machines, convenience stores, and restaurants.

IC Cards

Contactless smart cards like Suica, Pasma, and Icard, used to pay for public transport and small purchases across Japan. They can be recharged and are valid in multiple cities.



Airport transportation option

Keisei Skyliner / Narita Express (N'EX)

High-speed trains that connect Narita International Airport with central Tokyo. The Keisei Skyliner is the fastest option, while the Narita Express is part of the JR network and can be used with a JR Pass.

Limousine Bus

A comfortable airport shuttle service in Japan that connects major airports (such as Narita and Haneda) with hotels and key transportation hubs in cities like Tokyo, Kyoto, and Osaka. Unlike regular buses, Limousine Buses offer spacious seating, luggage handling, and direct routes to popular destinations, making them a convenient option for travelers with large luggage or those seeking a stress-free journey to and from the airport.



Golden Week

A series of national holidays that occur from late April to early May, during which many Japanese people travel. This period can be very crowded and more expensive for travelers.

Sakura

The Japanese term for cherry blossoms, which are celebrated during the spring season. Japan's cherry blossom festivals are a major attraction for tourists.



Sumo

Japan's national sport, a form of competitive full-contact wrestling where a rikishi (sumo wrestler) attempts to force his opponent out of a circular ring or make him touch the ground with any part of his body other than the soles of his feet. Major sumo tournaments, known as basho, are held six times a year in different cities, with Tokyo being the most prominent venue.

Anime

A style of animation originating in Japan that encompasses a wide variety of genres and is popular both in Japan and globally. Some famous anime series and films include Naruto, One Piece, My Neighbor Totoro, and Attack on Titan. Visitors to Japan often explore anime-themed attractions, such as Akihabara in Tokyo, which is a hub for anime, manga, and gaming culture.
